What is autism?

Autism is a neurodevelopmental disability that affects the way people communicate and interact with the world.

Autistic people can present with:

- challenges with communication and interacting with others
- repetitive behaviours
- a strong interest in one topic or subject
- heightened sensory perceptions, including being over or under-sensitive to sight, sound, touch, smell and taste
- a preference for routines and dislike of change

It's estimated that 1 in every 100 Australians is autistic and that 85% of the community has a personal connection to an autistic person.

Common questions

Q I'm not sure if I am - or my family member is - Autistic. Can I still contact you?

A Yes, we will talk to you about your experience and give general advice on assessment, diagnosis and further supports.

Q I need help with multiple issues. Is that okay?

A People who contact Autism Connect usually have 3-4 issues to discuss. We provide information and advice on a wide range of subjects, so don't hesitate to get in touch.

Q I need a referral to a speech pathologist. Can you give me one?

A We can guide you to identify appropriate health professionals. However, Autism Connect advisors can't provide medical referrals, such as for speech pathologists or occupational therapists.

Q I need support figuring out the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS). Can Amaze help me?

A The NDIS can sometimes be complex and challenging to understand. We provide practical advice and information to help.
